2015 COMMUNITY IMPACT

In 2015, the Ascentra Credit Union Foundation made significant strides in achieving its mission while successfully implementing its first major fundraising event—The Inaugural Paul Lensmeyer Golf Outing. Our efforts have positively impacted many communities through the creation of our Leadership Grants, a \$50,000 commitment to Junior Achievement of the Heartland over a four year period, and becoming the \$50,000 co-sponsor of a Habitat for Humanity home in Davenport, Iowa.

LEADERSHIP GRANTS

In 2015, the Ascentra Credit Union Foundation established its Leadership grants and presented \$17,000 to 37 different charities

Fostering community development and investing to enhance the financial viability of the underserved are key parts of the mission of the Ascentra Credit Union Foundation. These values align perfectly with the work Habitat for Humanity Quad Cities does. The Ascentra Credit Union Foundation stepped up as the \$50,000 co-sponsor of a habitat home to help make their next build possible, along with the Scott County Housing Council, ALCOA and the Habitat ReStore. More than \$100,000 must be raised for each house Habitat builds in the Quad Cities.



The Falas were selected into the Habitat program in June of 2014 and have been earning sweat equity hours since. By the time their home is completed, the family will have worked a minimum of 500 hours and attended a series of homeownership classes. The Fala family worked

to build their home alongside hundreds of volunteers. The Ascentra crew was also present on two consecutive days to help on the early stages of building this home for the Falas.

Habitat for Humanity Quad Cities is hard at work to eliminate poverty housing and improve the lives of hard working, low income families.
